Registration shows consumers and clients that you have met the minimum standards to call yourself a RID. Clients can be assured you have the education, examination, and experience necessary to be a professional interior designer.

Additionally, registration laws gives consumers a venue for the redress of grievances and complaints against RIDs.

Numbers don't lie. If you want to enhance your state's interior design legislation, high numbers of RIDs show legislators that registration matters to the profession.

Registration shows that interior designers are registered design professionals on par with architects, landscape architects, and engineers for their specific area of expertise.





The state of Tennessee requires an interior design degree from a Council for Interior Design Accreditation (CIDA) accredited program, at least two years of relevant & diverse interior design experience, and successful passage of the National Council of Interior Design Qualification (NCIDQ) examination.

What is NCIDQ Interior Design Certification?

NCIDQ Certification is the industry's recognized indicator of proficiency in interior design principles and a designer's commitment to the profession.

The Value of NCIDQ Certification

NCIDQ Certificate holders have proven their expertise in understanding and applying current codes established to protect public health, safety, and welfare.

Passage of the NCIDQ Examination is required for interior design licensure/registration in every regulated jurisdiction within the United States and Canada with the exception of California. It is the **only examination recognized by these state and provincial regulators and therefore required for the practice of many types of interior design**. Designers certified through the NCIDQ Exam gain wide industry visibility and recognition.

The strenuous requirements of the NCIDQ Exam give clients and employers added confidence in the caliber of work from NCIDQ Certified interior designers. The exam covers seven areas that capture the core competencies of interior design: **building systems, codes, construction standards, contract administration, design application, professional practice and project coordination.**

NCIDQ Certification Earned Through Examination

To earn certification, qualified interior designers can apply to take the NCIDQ Exam. After CIDQ approves their eligibility, candidates purchase and schedule each of the three sections of the exam and must pass each

section within a specified time-frame.


The three separate sections of the NCIDQ Exam are: the Fundamentals Exam (IDFX), the Professional Exam (IDPX), and the Practicum Exam (PRAC). **All three sections focus entirely on public health, safety, and welfare.**

To ensure the NCIDQ Exam tests interior designers' understanding of concepts crucial to the field, **CIDQ** undertakes a practice analysis of the interior design profession every five to seven years. The most recent practice analysis, completed in 2019, was based on information gathered through an online survey of more than 700 interior designers. A panel of experts in the field analyzed those results with our partners at our testing company and provided guidance on core competencies to cover.

Find Information About Regulated Professions and Activities

Search by Profession, Regulation Name or Topic

- Simply search for either the profession name, regulation name or by a topic name. For example, if you're looking for a Cosmetologist license, you can search for "Cosmetologist" or even by a related term such as "hair".
- Results will include applications, renewals, verifications, reinstatements and more.
- Results will also include a list of requirements, fees and other important information associated with a regulation.
- The Regulatory Licenses currently available include those professions regulated and licensed within the Department of Commerce and Insurance, Division of Regulatory Boards, and the Department of Agriculture, Division of Consumer and Industry Services.
